Army poorly equipped for mission, soldier tells TV

Quebec -- A member of the Canadian Armed Forces who has recently returned from Afghanistan has told a Quebec television network that he and his fellow soldiers are poorly equipped for their mission.

In an interview with French-language network TVA, Corporal Daniel Beaulieu said yesterday the equipment is better suited for peacekeeping missions.

The military told the network it would comment on Cpl. Beaulieu's claims today. Cpl. Beaulieu is an 11-year veteran of the military with three abroad missions under his belt, including two in Afghanistan.
